### BARKSDALE FAMILY AND CHILD YOUTH SERVICES (CYS) | 318-456-4139

Office for all programs at Barksdale which offers comprehensive support for military kids, including childcare, youth centers with activities (sports, arts, education, tech), sports leagues, and support for families.

### Child Development Center (CDC) | West 318-456-2735 | East 318-456-1081

The Barksdale CDC offers full day care for children from six weeks to five years. Open from 7:00 AM to 5:30 PM with two buildings next door to one another on main base called East or West. Care must be requested online at **MilitaryChildcare.com**, a Department of Defense (DoD) website, for military families seeking Child Care, School Age Care Programs, and Family Child Care (FCC) Homes. You can apply up to 1 year in advance, and you can get on a wait list at multiple CDCs so if there are two PCS options on the table, apply at both. Offer part day enrichment as well. ### Family Childcare Program (FCC) | 318-456-9688

Family Childcare is regular care of a child in the home of another family, on or off base, from ages four weeks to 12 years of age. FCC providers can also offer free child care for extended duty, deployments and PCS. Contact the FSS office by phone or email for personalized care information. ### **Kinderspot**

Are you looking to offer or rent short term care at the CDC? Download Kinderspot today! Spot holders, who create a Kinderspot account, will be able to offer week long blocks of time per child. At participating CDC's, their spot is temporarily available when their child is not attending. Prospective spot renters can create a Kinderspot account even if they do not hold a spot at the CDC. Available weeks will be visible at participating CDC's, and renters can inform the CDC admin of their desire to rent. Once they have completed paperwork at the CDC, and become a verified renter, they can book available week(s) through the app.

Located on main base, the Barksdale Youth Center Program consists of year round programs for children in kindergarten through high school (ages 6-18). School Age Care programs offer care before and after school, and hourly care. Transportation is provided to several local elementary schools for those enrolled in School Age Care.

Transportation is available in the morning and afternoon to:

- Haughton Schools: T.L. Rodes E.S. (pre-k-1), Platte E.S. (grades 2-3)
- Bossier City Schools: W.T. Lewis Elementary, & Stockwell Place Elementary

Advocates for military children at local, state, and national levels to ensure their educational needs are met. Helps families with inbound and outbound school transfers and provides information on local schools and graduation requirements. Provides information and resources to help families navigate special education services, including Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) and Section 504 Plans. Assists families who choose to home school their children.

### SCHOOL ZONING

The base is located in the Bossier Parish School District. However, Louisiana offers military families **School of Choice** where active duty members, who are base residents with military-connected students, have the option to send their student to any school in the **Bossier Parish School District** or **Caddo School District** (up to the school's functional capacity). Parent's are responsible for transportation.

Main Base Housing (Historic & Main Base Neighborhoods) is zoned for:

• Waller Elementary (pre-k to 5), Rusheon Middle School (grades 6-8), Bossier High School (grades 9-12)

East Side Housing (Heritage Heights & Liberty Neighborhoods) is zoned for:

• T.L. Rodes Elementary (pre-k-1), Platte Elementary (grades 2-3), Princeton Elementary (grades 4-5), Haughton Middle School (grades 6-8), Haughton High School (grades 9-12)

It also highlights Louisiana's Purple Star Schools—a designation awarded to schools that go above and beyond to support students from military families.

### **HIGHER EDUCATION**

**Louisiana Department of Veteran Affairs** | Title 29 In-State Tuition Exemption Louisiana's in-state tuition exemption, <u>Title 29</u>, provides educational benefits for children, spouses and surviving spouses of veterans who meet certain requirements. For living veterans, children are eligible; for veterans who are POW/MIA, spouses are eligible; and for deceased veterans, surviving spouses and children are eligible.

### Family Advocacy Program (FAP) | 318-456-6595

Family Advocacy Program (FAP) personnel provide a continuum of services designed to build community health and resilience and promote family, community, and mission readiness by reducing domestic abuse and child maltreatment. Services are available for military members and eligible beneficiaries. FAP offers family assessments, case management, safety, and intervention planning. Additional services include, individual/couples therapy, new parent support services, and anger management.

### Exceptional Family Member Program Medical | (EFMP) | 318-456-1736

The Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) is designed to provide support to military family members with special needs. EFMP is a mandatory enrollment program that protects federal entitlements and military benefits of special needs family members.

Barksdale AFB does not provide emergency or urgent medical care services in any facility.

If you are experiencing a life-threatening medical situation (including mental health emergencies), call 911 immediately. Emergency care services treat life-threatening medical issues such as threats to your life, limbs, sight, or safety.

Active duty do not need prior authorization for the emergency room, only Urgent Care.

The commissary is the military grocery store. Base commissaries are operated by Defense Commissary Agency (DeCA) at installations stateside and around the world. Active duty and retired, Reserve and Guard (on orders), and family members with proper military ID can purchase food and other items at cost with no sales tax. Commissaries are required by law to sell items at prices set only high enough to recover item cost, with no profit or overhead factored into item price. Because the commissary charges you what it costs them, prices will vary from commissary to commissary, depending on local costs. You will see a 5% surcharge covers the operational costs – cashier's salaries, electricity, etc. Check the **website** for click2go account, coupons, recipes, sales flyers, employment and more by location.

East Reservation Housing is located several miles from Barksdale's main base, typically about a 10–15 minute drive depending on the gate used and traffic. The area is more spread out and quieter than main-base housing, offering a neighborhood-style setting with larger green spaces and easier parking. Families often appreciate the lower traffic, playgrounds, walking areas, and quick access to outdoor recreation spots. Because it sits off the main installation, residents should plan for commuting time to base services such as the BX, commissary, and medical clinic. It's a good option for those who want more space and a less congested environment while still staying connected to the base community.

Located on Barksdale Air Force Base, the museum highlights the rich heritage of the 2nd Bomb Wing, Strategic Air Command (SAC), and Air Force Global Strike Command. Visitors can explore a large outdoor aircraft park featuring iconic platforms such as multiple B-52s, an SR-71 Blackbird, and even a Vulcan bomber. Inside, exhibits cover a wide range of aviation and military history, including a 9/11 display featuring President Bush's podium and detailed presentations on nuclear weapons development and deterrence. The museum is open to the public. Guests can expect an immersive experience—walking among massive bombers in the air park and exploring indoor galleries dedicated to the 8th Air Force, historic missions, and key moments in U.S. aviation history.

# **BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE**

### HISTORY OF BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE

The story of Barksdale Air Force Base began in 1924, when Shreveport residents first expressed interest in hosting a military airfield. Their efforts involved years of proposals and negotiations, and although the initial plan was rejected, persistence paid off. On December 5, 1928, a site in Bossier Parish—then unincorporated land near Bossier City—was selected from a field of 80 candidates. The City of Shreveport undertook the enormous task of purchasing the property, acquiring more than 800 parcels for \$1.5 million, annexing the land, and finally donating it to the federal government. In return, the government assumed responsibility for constructing the new installation.

Construction of Barksdale Field began in 1931, guided by an elegant Beaux-Arts radial site plan and an architectural vision rooted in the French Colonial Revival style. The base's early buildings featured terra-cotta and stucco exteriors, red-tile roofs, French windows, and wrought-iron accents—designs inspired by the region's heritage and local materials. The original plan included quarters for 200 officers, barracks for 1,500 enlisted men, administrative buildings, a gymnasium, a YMCA, a chapel, and hangars large enough to support more than 100 aircraft. Landscape architects called for live oaks along Barksdale Boulevard and native species along adjoining streets, giving the new base a distinctive Southern character.

Barksdale Field was formally established in 1932 and dedicated on February 2, 1933. It was named in honor of Lieutenant Eugene Hoy Barksdale (1896–1926), a distinguished World War I aviator who flew with the British Royal Flying Corps before serving with the American Expeditionary Forces. After the war, he became a U.S. test pilot and tragically lost his life in 1926 during a flight-test accident. Before the base was built, the land had been dominated by cotton plantations, making the installation's development a dramatic transformation of the local landscape. In 1948, with the creation of the United States Air Force, Barksdale Field was officially redesignated Barksdale Air Force Base.

One of the installation's most notable areas is its historic residential district. Constructed between 1930 and 1941, the neighborhood includes single family homes and duplexes originally built for members of the 3rd Attack Group. This French Colonial Revival district—featuring red-tile roofs, stucco facades, wrought iron railings and tree-lined streets—was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1992. Damage from the severe winter storms of 2021 led to the demolition of the several deteriorated units. Despite these losses, many of the historic homes remain, continuing to reflect the architectural character and heritage of the installation.

Across the runway, the base's eastern side once housed a separate and highly secretive installation known as Bossier Base. Opened in 1951, it operated independently from Barksdale AFB and was administered by the Armed Forces Special Weapons Project under the Atomic Energy Commission. The facility served as one of only six U.S. stockpile sites for nuclear-weapon components, a fact kept classified until congressional testimony in 1957. As Cold War tensions eased, the mission at Bossier Base diminished, and the facility was officially closed in 1970. Most of its structures were later demolished, though a historical marker—placed in 2015—preserves its legacy. The area is now incorporated into Barksdale's East Reservation.

Today, Barksdale Air Force Base remains a cornerstone of America's strategic defense. It serves as headquarters for Air Force Global Strike Command (AFGSC), activated on August 7, 2009 to manage the Air Force's portion of the nation's nuclear arsenal. The base is also home to Headquarters Eighth Air Force, the 2nd Bomb Wing and the 307th Bomb Wing.

Nearly a century after its founding, Barksdale continues to stand at the center of U.S. airpower, blending a rich architectural and cultural heritage with a vital modern mission.




### FUN FACTS ABOUT BARKSDALE AFB

- It's older than the U.S. Air Force. Barksdale Field opened in 1933, 15 years before the Air Force became its own military branch in 1948.
- The Barksdale Historic District refers to the Barksdale Field Historic District at Barksdale Air Force Base
  which is the largest historic district in north Louisiana and is listed on the National Register of Historic
  Places. It includes over 300 buildings constructed between 1931 and 1941, showcasing a variety of early
  20th-century architectural styles like French Colonial Revival.
- The base's original architecture—tile roofs, stucco walls, wrought-iron balconies—gives parts of Barksdale the feel of a "little French village."
- Live oaks line Barksdale Boulevard, and other streets were planted in the 1930's. The original base
  housing was built to be fireproof and even earthquake resistant, which was extremely unusual for
  Louisiana construction in the early 1930s.
- The base is home to a massive natural wildlife area: Barksdale's reservation includes more than 18,000 acres of forest, wetlands, and lakes, one of the largest natural habitats on any Air Force installation, supporting deer, bald eagles, wild hogs, and even alligators.
- Barksdale maintains one of the longest runways in the Air Force: Its main runway is 11,000 feet long!
- The B-52s at Barksdale are older than their pilots—and sometimes their commanders: Most B-52Hs were built in the early 1960s and are projected to fly beyond 2050.
- Barksdale once served as a stage for Hollywood: The base and B-52 bombers appear in several films and TV productions, including "By Dawn's Early Light" (1990) and documentaries about nuclear deterrence.
- President George W. Bush used Barksdale as a secure location on 9/11: Air Force One landed at Barksdale on the day of the attacks, where the president addressed the nation.
- Barksdale is home to the oldest bomb wing in the Air Force: The 2nd Bomb Wing dates back to World War I and still flies the B-52H Stratofortress.
- It became the headquarters for nuclear operations in 2009: Barksdale is home to Air Force Global Strike Command, which oversees the majority of the U.S. nuclear arsenal and all Air Force long-range bombers.
- The 307th is the only Air Force Reserve unit flying the B-52H Stratofortress, and they also run the Formal Training Unit (FTU)—that means they train new B-52 crews right on Barksdale AFB.


# ORGANIZATIONAL CHART

- The SECAF and CSAF lead the Air Force in working on service-wide issues.
- There are eleven Major Command (MAJCOM) specializing in management of forces to assure they are organized, trained, and equipped. These organizations are based on functionality and geography. The MAJCOM commander is typically a 4- or 3-star General.
  - The functionally based Major Commands are:
    - Air Combat Command
    - Air Education and Training Command
    - Air Force Global Strike Command
    - Air Force Material Command
    - Air Force Reserve Command
    - Air Force Space Command
    - Air Force Special Operations Command
    - Air Force Mobility Command
  - The geographically based Major Commands are:
    - Pacific Air Forces
    - United States Air Forces Central Command
    - United States Air Forces in Europe Air Forces Africa



There are twenty-five Numbered Air Forces (NAF) which are referred to as tactical echelons, providing operational leadership and supervision for the assigned operational units under them. "A numbered Air Force is usually assigned for geographical purposes, and primarily used only during wartime. In peacetime, they generally only consist of a limited number of headquarters staff whose job it is to prepare and maintain wartime plans." The NAF commander is typically a 3- or 2-star General.

Within the NAFs are wings, groups, and squadrons. Just like the MAJCOMs and NAFs, the wings are spread throughout the world. Wings are led by either Brigadier Generals or Colonels. Most wings have approximately four groups within them, consisting of an Operational Group, Maintenance Group, Mission Support Group, and Medical Group. Groups are typically led by Colonels.

Organizations under the groups are the squadrons, which are known as the pulse in the Air Force. The Air Force has around 3,300 squadrons. Squadrons are primarily led by Lieutenant Colonels, but you can find some squadrons led by Majors and Captains. While the support squadrons, groups, and wings rarely deploy together, the operational flying squadrons are more likely to deploy intact.

o Squadrons come in all sizes ranging from 7 personnel to over 600 personnel. The squadrons are usually fairly specialized in a tactical or functional mission. The traditional squadrons most are familiar with include fighter squadrons, bomber squadrons, mobility squadrons, tanker squadrons, missile squadrons, intelligence, surveillance reconnaissance squadrons, command and control squadrons, and training squadrons. These specialized squadrons, along with an operational support squadron, usually make up the operational group on any specific base. Other squadrons include medical squadrons, aircraft maintenance squadrons, civil engineering squadrons, mission support squadrons, and security forces squadrons.

# BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE

### **MISSION**


The Eighth Airforce, nicknamed "Mighty Eighth" (8th AF) is a warfighting headquarters constantly ready to deploy global air power and command an air operation wherever needed.

The **2nd Bomb Wing (2 BW)** is the host unit at Barksdale Air Force Base, responsible for managing the base's operations related to its B-52 bomber fleet. It oversees all aircraft maintenance, weapons loading, and training, supporting thousands of flying hours and sorties each year. As the cornerstone of the base, 2 BW ensures the readiness of personnel and resources while supporting national defense missions worldwide.

The **307th Bomb Wing** is an Air Force Reserve unit flying the B-52 and is the only bomb wing to operate two platforms (B-52 and detached B-1). It also has the only nuclear-certified squadron in the Air Force Reserve Command. The 307th BW is responsible for flying and maintaining 20 B-52 Stratofortress aircraft and provides all initial and requalification training for B-52 aircrew across the entire Air Force.

Barksdale AFB is also home to 31 associate units, including Det. 2, 57th Wing (B-52 Weapons School), the 49th Test Squadron (bomber operational testing), and the 548th Combat Training Squadron (Air Warrior II).

• East Reservation is zoned for schools in Haughton. Main base is zoned for schools in Bossier, just north of the base.




Barksdale AFB, in 3D, in relation to Shreveport, North Bossier and South Bossier areas. North Facing.

### **MILITARY PERSONNEL & VEHICLES IN LA:**

### Military Personnel - Automobile Liability Insurance Premium Discount

Louisiana offers a 25% auto insurance discount for active-duty military, reservists, and National Guard members based in the state. This discount was expanded by a 2024 law to also include retired military and veterans with a 50% or greater disability rating. To get the discount, you must apply with your insurer by submitting the required documentation, such as military orders or a commander's letter.

### **Motor Vehicle Sale Tax Exemption**

Military personnel are exempt from payment of use tax on motor vehicles imported into Louisiana while on active duty, providing they have proof that sales tax was previously paid on their vehicle in one of the 50 states. In addition, a photocopy of their military ID and orders, or a statement from their commanding officer, verifying they are active duty military personnel is required.



### **State Facts**

Louisiana, reflecting its French heritage, is the only U.S. state with parishes instead of counties, one of just two states not divided into counties (the other is Alaska).

The brown pelican became Louisiana's official bird on July 27, 1966. It nests from South Carolina to Brazil. Pelicans are famous for their large bill, the lower portion of which has a pouch which may be greatly extended.

The large creamy-white bloom of the magnolia tree was designated the state flower in 1900 because of the abundance of trees throughout the state. The magnolia is an evergreen and the flower is usually fragrant. After the six to twelve petals of the flower have fallen away the large cone shaped fruit of the magnolia is exposed.

This official flag of Louisiana is that flag now in general use, consisting of a solid blue field with the coat-of-arms of the state, the pelican feeding its young, in white in the center, with a ribbon beneath, also in white, containing in blue the motto of the state, "Union, Justice and Confidence". It was adopted by an Act of the Legislature in 1912.

The fleur-de-lis, a stylized lily, reflects Louisiana's rich French heritage and enduring spirit. It symbolizes loyalty, resilience, and pride, appearing throughout the state's culture, history, and community. Pronounced FLUR-duh-LEE
